



Sources 1-4: unheighted (or adiaSTEMATIC) neumes



Sources 5-8: adaptations of the neumes, to make secure pitch notation possible




Ex. 7 uses the alphabet segment **g-o** as the equivalent of our **a-g**. Its version of *Alleluia Pascha nostrum* starts on the pitch **g**, then another pitch **g**, and then a three-note ligature marked **g-h-k**, which is **g, a, c** in our letter system. Write out the whole Alleluia in modern notation, and compare it with the melodic versions in 5-6 and 8. Does it match the latter three?
